The main authorities of Tarija and Yunchará, in collaboration with PROMETA, launched the Carrera de Veterinaria Altoandina (Degree in Andean Veterinary Medicine), which will benefit students between 14 and 24 years old.

"We are very happy with this new educational opportunity for our youth, we hope to have the same training for our staff in a near future", said Gladys Alarcón, Major of Yunchará, at the launching that counted with the presence of the Tarija governor, Adrián Oliva.

Students will be able to obtain three different certificates at the technician level, which will be issued by the Ministry of Education. The educational programme main goal is to train local people for the transfer of techniques to their communities and extend their employment opportunities.

The educational programme it is one of the desired results of the Project, as it contributes to the development of rural communities and responds to their needs of specific knowledge on Andean livestock production.

Previously, the Project team carried out preliminary work to generate partnerships with institutions in order to design the curriculum and the institutional and academic management.
